

## Redefining Treatment: Conservative Management of Capitulum Humerus Fracture in an Elderly Patient

### Conservative Treatment of Displaced Fracture of Humeral Capitulum: A Case Report

**Abstract**  
We report the closed case of a 80-year-old male who sustained an injury to the right elbow after a fall from a motorcycle. Plain radiographs revealed a displaced humeral capitulum fracture (type I) (see Figure 1) and MRI classification I. Closed reduction was performed under anesthesia, and an elbow cast was placed. Anatomical position was obtained, which was confirmed with intraoperative tomography scan. Two months after the injury, elbow motion was achieved, and a full range of motion was demonstrated. At 3-year post-injury, associated osteoporosis was treated with a complete range of motion protocol in the unaffected side. Although closed, this case is considered the accepted non-surgical treatment for humeral capitulum fracture type I, as per Bryan and Morrey classification (see Figure 1) can be effectively treated by closed reduction.

**Keywords:** Closed reduction, displaced fracture, humeral capitulum fracture

**Case Presentation**  
A 80-year-old male, right hand dominant, sustained an injury on his elbow while driving a two-wheeler. He was immediately brought to the hospital. On examination, he had restricted motion in the elbow joint along with pain. Plain radiographs showed displaced right humeral capitulum fracture type I, as per Bryan and Morrey classification (Figure 1).

**Treatment and Technique**  
A closed reduction was attempted in the patient refused operative option. Patient was taken to the procedure room, and under sterile conditions, the reduction was attempted. The reduction technique was performed with the patient in the supine position. The lateral supracondylar radiol was palpated, and distal end was marked. With the elbow in extension, with traction at the wrist and counter traction above the elbow, the marked point was pushed and rolled with the thumb distally in the radial head direction. The elbow was then fixed under continued traction. An above elbow cast was applied in 90-degree flexion and the forearm in a prone position with the wrist in 5-degree extension.

**Outcome and Follow-up**  
A well-matched above-elbow cast was applied for 25 days. The cast was removed, and a plain radiograph (Figure 2) was obtained, which revealed a good union of the fracture. Physiotherapy with a range of motion exercises was started along with an above elbow brace made with fibreglass bandage applied for a week, gradually increasing an early range of motion. After 40 days, full range of motion exercises were started. Thereafter, the patient was allowed weight bearing and normal daily activities. At 3 months post-injury, elbow motion was

**Prognostic plain radiograph (Figure 2) and computerized tomography scan (Figure 3) depicted almost a satisfactory reduction of displaced fragments in a normal anatomical position.**

**Following reduction, stability was maintained in a cast for 15 days allowing the swelling to subside. Lateral X-rays were done to observe the fragment, and the elbow was mobilized under supervision.**

In a remarkable case that challenges standard orthopaedic practice, our department recently managed an **80-year-old female** with a fracture of the **capitulum of the right humerus** — a fracture that is almost **universally considered 100% operative**.

Traditionally, such fractures are managed surgically, with no standard reduction technique described in the literature for non-operative treatment. However, drawing on prior clinical experience and a technique published in the **Uttarakhand Journal of Orthopaedics**, our consultant decided to pursue a conservative approach.

Using this original, **non-operative reduction technique**, a **closed reduction** was performed. A **post-reduction CT scan** confirmed anatomical alignment of the fracture — a highly rare and encouraging outcome. The patient is now being managed conservatively, without surgery, and is progressing well under observation.

This case adds further weight to the work already documented and published by **Dr. Anant Jain in the Uttarakhand Journal of Orthopaedics**. It's a testament to how clinical observation, experience, and bold thinking can challenge established norms and redefine treatment possibilities — particularly in elderly or high-risk populations.

This case also underscores THFH's continued commitment to evidence-based innovation, and to placing the patient's unique needs at the center of every decision.

# Patient Story of Triumph

ENT Surgery - Hans Hospital, Haridwar

## Right Modified Radical Mastoidectomy with Type III Tympanoplasty and Meatoplasty



### DURING THE SURGERY

On 3rd July 2025, our ENT team successfully performed a complex 4-hour ear surgery on Priyanshu, a 15-year-old boy diagnosed with **Right Atticoantral Squamous Chronic Mastoiditis with Mastoid Fistula**.

This serious ear condition, if left untreated, can lead to both life-threatening and extra-cranial complications.

Under the expertise of **Dr. Sameer Topno (Surgeon)** and **Dr. Venus (Anesthetist)**, with the dedicated assistance of **Rajesh, Deepak, and Shamisha** in the OT, the patient underwent **Right Modified Radical Mastoidectomy (MRM) with Type III Tympanoplasty and Meatoplasty**. The goal was to completely remove the disease from the ear and mastoid while preserving and restoring hearing.

The surgery, performed under **general anesthesia**, was a complete success. **Priyanshu** was discharged in good condition and is recovering well. This achievement highlights our **hospital's dedication to delivering advanced surgical care** even in the most challenging cases. Successfully completing the intricate 4-hour surgery marked another milestone in our commitment to clinical excellence.

### जन-जन तक स्वास्थ्य सेवा



जुलाई 2025 द हंस फाउंडेशन जनरल हॉस्पिटल, सतपुली के लिए सेवा और आउटरीच का विशेष महीना रहा। हमारी समर्पित टीमों ने लंबी दूरी, कठिन भौगोलिक परिस्थितियाँ और प्रतिकूल मौसम का सामना करते हुए गुणवत्तापूर्ण स्वास्थ्य सेवाएँ सीधे लोगों तक पहुँचाईं।

#### मेगा जनरल कैंप – अल्मोड़ा (19 जुलाई 2025)

सतपुली से लगभग **270 किलोमीटर** दूर अल्मोड़ा में हमारी डॉक्टरों और सहयोगी स्टाफ की टीम ने एक दिवसीय मेगा जनरल कैंप आयोजित किया। केवल एक दिन में **400 से अधिक रोगियों** की स्वास्थ्य जाँच और परामर्श किया गया।

कैंप में जिन रोगियों को ऑपरेशन की आवश्यकता पाई गई, उन्हें हमारे अस्पताल लाया गया और सफलतापूर्वक उनके ऑपरेशन किए गए।

#### नेत्र महोत्सव (15 से 22 जुलाई 2025)

**15 से 22 जुलाई** तक हमारे अस्पताल में नेत्र महोत्सव का आयोजन हुआ। प्रतिकूल मौसम के बावजूद करीब **1000 रोगी ओपीडी** में पहुँचे।

हमारी ऑप्टल्मोलॉजी टीम ने लगभग **80 रोगियों** को ऑपरेशन की आवश्यकता बताई, जिनमें से **50%** का ऑपरेशन उसी दिन किया गया और बाकी निर्धारित तिथियों पर सफलतापूर्वक पूरे हुए।

#### मेगा जनरल कैंप – पैठाणी, पौड़ी गढ़वाल (14 जुलाई 2025)

महीने की शुरुआत में हमारी **आउटरीच टीम ने पैठाणी, पौड़ी गढ़वाल** में एक मेगा जनरल कैंप आयोजित किया। ग्रामीण निवासियों को व्यापक स्वास्थ्य जांच और परामर्श प्रदान किया गया।

यहाँ भी, जिन मरीजों को ऑपरेशन की आवश्यकता थी, उन्हें अस्पताल लाकर सर्जरी कराई गई, जिससे समय पर और गुणवत्तापूर्ण इलाज संभव हुआ।

You need good food to shine like the sun.



# Medical Facts and Trivia :

## DO YOU KNOW ?

1. **The Rarest Blood Type Isn't AB Negative.**   
A surgery called hemispherectomy (removal of one half of the brain) can be performed in severe epilepsy cases — and patients, especially children, can still function surprisingly well.
2. **You Can Bleed from Your Eyes.**   
A rare condition called haemolacria causes people to shed bloody tears. It can be caused by injury, infection, or extreme hormonal changes.
3. **Brain Surgery Can Be Done While You're Awake.**   
In some brain operations (like tumor removal near speech centers), patients are kept awake and talking so surgeons can avoid damaging critical areas.
5. **Teeth Can "Remember" Trauma.**   
Teeth record certain stress events in enamel (like malnutrition or illness in childhood). Dentists and anthropologists can actually see signs of past trauma under a microscope — like growth rings in trees!
6. **Hypothermia Can Save Lives.**   
In trauma or cardiac arrest, doctors sometimes induce mild hypothermia to slow metabolism and reduce brain damage — essentially putting the body into hibernation.


